SECTION 1: OVERVIEW

These procedures outline the pathway for selection to the 2025 Junior Pan American Games (Games) in Rifle and Pistol.

The maximum team size can be two (2) athletes per gender in each individual event (rifle and pistol), totaling four (4) athletes per gender, two in rifle and two in pistol. However final team size will depend on earned Confederation of the Americas (CAT) quota. CAT quotas are awarded to USA Shooting.

SECTION 2: ATHLETE REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Nationality/Passports Requirements:
 - Have a valid United States passport by March 1, 2025, that does not expire for six months after the conclusion of the Games.
- 2. Minimum Panam Sports Requirements:
 - Abide by the rules in the Panam Sports Constitution, including nationality/citizenship requirements.
 - For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the Panam Sports Constitution (Article 34.4-7).
 - Abide by the Panam Sports Eligibility of Conditions Form/Conditions of Participation Form.
- 3. LOC Requirements:
 - Comply with all rules and policies implemented by the LOC.
- 4. Continental Federation (CF) Requirements:
 - Comply with all CAT eligibility requirements found here: <u>https://www.panamsports.org/en/documents/?doc_category=games</u>
 - All participating athletes must be within the U22 category (athletes born in 2004 or after), athletes cannot be older than 21 years old until December 21, 2025; complying with article 3.7.4.12 of the International Shooting Federation.
- 5. USOPC Requirements:
 - Comply with all USOPC rules applicable to the Games (e.g., Demonstrations).
 - o Complete all USOPC Games Registration requirements by the stated deadline.
 - Comply with the USOPC Delegation Terms, including the Conduct Requirements, which will be made available here: <u>https://www.usopc.org/games-and-qualification</u>
 - o Comply with the <u>USOPC Athlete Safety Policy</u> and the <u>U.S. Center for SafeSport Code</u>.
 - Undergo a background screen in accordance with the current <u>USOPC Background Check Policy</u> if you will be age 18 or older.
- 6. NGB Requirements:

- Comply with the NGB Athlete Agreement.
- Comply with the <u>NGB Code of Conduct</u>.
- Comply with the <u>NGB SafeSport Policy</u>.
- Athlete must have an active NGB membership. Athlete does not have an active suspension from the U.S. Center for SafeSport that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Games.
- Athlete does not have an active sanction for an anti-doping rule/policy violation that would make the Athlete ineligible to participate in the Games.

SECTION 3: OTHER MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE TEAM

- Meet the U.S. Center for SafeSport's education and training requirements in accordance with the <u>USOPC</u>
 <u>Athlete Safety Policy</u> if you will be 18 or older on the day after the Closing Ceremony.
- Agree to be bound by and adhere to all Panam Sports, WADA, CAT, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing and an agreement to be bound to the results management authority of Panam Sports, WADA, CAT, USADA, or other Anti-Doping Organization as applicable. Meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, local laws, USOPC, CAT and/or the Local Organizing Committee.

SECTION 5: SELECTION PROCESS

5.1 TOTAL QUOTA PLACES:

USA Shooting is eligible to earn up to two (2) quotas per gender in both Rifle and Pistol at the Games. Quotas will be obtained at the Rifle/Pistol Qualification Event, to be held on February 27-March 6, 2025 in Asuncion, Paraguay. Quotas will be assigned to USA Shooting and will not be given to the athlete by name.

In the event that USA Shooting does not earn maximum quota at the Rifle/Pistol Qualification Event, additional quota may be obtained through reallocation, to be confirmed by CAT no later than April 11, 2025.

5.2 EVALUATION EVENT QUALIFICATION PATHWAY:

USA Shooting Junior Olympics are open to all active USA Shooting members that are born in 2004 or later, that

qualified through their state Junior Olympic Qualifier. All athletes must register through the USA Shooting website.

5.3 NOMINATION TO THE TEAM:

USA Shooting Junior Olympics has been designated as the Selection Match to the Games. Available quotas will be awarded to athletes by order of ranking in each event (Rifle and Pistol) at the conclusion of the Selection Match.

The Selection of the top placing athletes will be based on:

- a) Combined Qualification Score from two day 60 shot qualification match, and
- b) Additional points awarded based on finals placements, as follows:

For Rifle:

- a. 4 points for 1st place
- b. 3.5 points for 2nd place
- c. 3.0 points for 3rd place
- d. 2.5 points for 4th place
- e. 2.0 points for 5th place
- f. 1.5 points for 6th place
- g. 1.0 point for 7th place
- h. 0.5 points for 8th place

For Pistol:

- a. 8 points for 1st place
- b. 7 points for 2nd place
- c. 6 points for 3rd place
- d. 5 points for 4th place
- e. 4 points for 5th place
- f. 3 points for 6th place
- g. 2 points for 7th place
- h. 1 point for 8th place
- c) In case of a tie situation as it relates to the two day qualification scores, plus additional finals placement points, the athlete who finishes highest in the final will win the tie breaker. IE, if two athletes have an aggregate score, plus finals points of 1250, the person who finished 2nd in the final would win the tie breaker against the person who finished 4th in the final.
- d) The formula for selection is: day 1 score + day 2 score + finals points = combined score

5.4 <u>MIXED TEAM:</u>

USA Shooting may enter up to two (2) teams in both rifle and pistol. Teams must be comprised of athletes who have qualified as individuals. Teams will be formed based on ranking at the conclusion of the Selection Matches (i.e. the highest ranked Male athlete and the highest ranked Female athlete at the Selection Match will be named as Mixed Team 1, and so on).

In the event of a conflict between this overview and the CAT Qualification System, the CAT Qualification System will take precedent.

SECTION 8: DATE OF TEAM NOMINATION

USA Shooting will nominate the Team, including any replacements/alternates to the USOPC on or before June 16, 2025.

SECTION 9: REMOVAL OF ATHLETES FROM THE TEAM

9.1 NGB JURISDICTION

- a. NGB has jurisdiction over athlete nominees until athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the Local Organizing Committee. An athlete who is nominated to the Team may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by NGB:
 - i. <u>Voluntary withdrawal</u>. Athlete submits a written letter to the NGB CEO requesting to voluntarily withdraw from the Team.
 - ii. Injury or illness. A physician (or medical staff) approved by NGB provides certification that the

Athlete has a debilitating condition. If Athlete refuses to provide verification of their illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff), their injury will be assumed to be debilitating and they may be removed from the Team.

- iii. <u>Failure to participate</u>. Athlete does not participate in all Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in these procedures.
- iv. Code of Conduct Violation. Athlete violates the NGB Code of Conduct:
- v. Athlete Agreement. Athlete violates a term in their signed NGB Athlete Agreement.
- vi. <u>Non-compliance.</u> Athlete does not meet the athlete eligibility requirements listed in Section 2 and Section 3 of these selection procedures.
- b. An Athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team if found to have violated WADA, CAT, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and the NGB SafeSport Policy, as applicable.

9.2 USOPC JURISDICTION

- a. Once Athlete entries have been submitted by the USOPC to the Local Organizing Committee, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team.
- b. USOPC's Delegation Conduct Requirements apply in addition to the NGB Code of Conduct. The Delegation Conduct Requirements in the USOPC Games Delegation Terms are specific to each Games and are made available during the Games registration process.
- c. The USOPC's Grievance Procedures and Hearing Process are found within the USOPC Dispute Resolution Policy and Hearing Procedures.

SECTION 10: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS PRIOR TO SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

- 10.1 Should a vacancy occur prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, the athlete will be replaced by the next highest placing athlete in that same event at the Selection Matches.
- 10.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Sections 2-3.

SECTION 11: SELECTION PROCESS IF ATHLETE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES BY NAME TO THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

11.1 Should a vacancy occur after submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, if allowed, the same process as specified in Section 10 will be followed.

11.2 All replacement athletes must meet all requirements listed in Sections 2-3.

SECTION 12: RIGHT TO A HEARING

An athlete who is removed from the Team has the right to a hearing per the NGB's <u>complaint procedures</u> and the USOPC Bylaws (applies only for a Protected Competition), Section 9 (<u>https://www.usopc.org/governance/dispute-resolution</u>).

SECTION 13: REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

The following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Games:

SECTION 14: DISCLAIMERS

These procedures are based on Panam Sports and CAT rules and regulations as presently known and understood. Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in Panam Sports and/or CAT rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to NGB.

However, the selection criteria are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency. If any force of nature, pandemic, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions.

SECTION 15: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

All members of the Selection Committee (Section 6.3) and all individuals who developed these selection procedures (Section 21) must comply with USA Shooting's <u>Conflict of Interest Policy</u>, to include completing and submitting a disclosure form consistent with the [NGB's] Conflict of Interest Policy before convening the committee.

A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business relationship or interferes with, or maybe perceived to interfere with a committee member's ability to be impartial and participate in the selection process in a fair and impartial manner. Any member of the Selection Committee who has an actual, possible, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it to the NGB's Ethics Committee prior to the start of the selection process and may be required to recuse themself from the Selection Committee discussions and/or voting.

If a conflict exists, the NGB's Ethics Committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member's level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse themself from participating in discussions and/or voting).

During its review, the NGB Ethics Committee may ask a Selection Committee member or an affected person for more information at its discretion. For example, if a Selection Committee member is required to recuse themself from voting, the NGB Ethics Committee may still determine that a Selection Committee member who has relevant

and necessary information related to athlete performance, such as a national team coach or high performance director, may, if requested by the Selection Committee, provide that information to the Selection Committee if the information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and if the Selection Committee member with the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision.

Additionally, any person with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to the NGB at board@usashooting.org. Reports may also be made anonymously through the <u>USOPC's Integrity Portal</u>. No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest. In addition, the USOPC maintains a strict no retaliation policy that prohibits any employee, contractor, agent, volunteer, or member of the USOPC to take or threaten to take any action against an athlete for reporting information to or seeking assistance from the Office of the Athlete Ombuds.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with the NGB Selection Committee appointment process.

SECTION 17: GRIEVANCES

The <u>NGB Grievance Procedures</u> apply to these procedures.

Section 9 of the USOPC Bylaws provides a process for an athlete to file a complaint with the USOPC against an NGB alleging that they have been denied, or threatened to be denied, with the opportunity to participate in a Protected Competition, as defined in the USOPC bylaws. SECTION 18: NON-RETAILATION

The USOPC and NGB have zero tolerance for retaliation against people who make good faith reports of potential ethical, policy, or legal violations, or who cooperate with investigations of those reports. That means no USOPC or NGB staff, Board or Committee member, or volunteer may threaten, harass, discriminate against, or take any negative employment or related action (e.g., discharge, demotion, suspension, negative review) on that basis.

- Individuals may report concerns to the NGB by following the <u>NGB's Whistleblower Policy</u>.
- Individuals may report concerns to the USOPC confidentially, or anonymously, online using the <u>USOPC</u> <u>Integrity Portal</u> or individuals may call the USOPC Integrity Hotline at 1-877-404-9935.

SECTION 19: SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

NGB will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents, including scouting or evaluation forms, etc., and data from the selection process as required by the NGB's Records Retention Policy or for six months past the date of the 2025 Junior Pan American Games, whichever is longer.

SECTION 20: QUALIFICATION FOR THE 2027 PAN AMERICAN GAMES

Gold medalists in all Shooting individual events from the 2025 Junior Pan American Games will qualify by name for the 2027 Pan American Games in Lima, Peru, which are currently scheduled for September 23 to October 7, 2027.

If the athlete who earned the quota cannot participate in the 2027 Pan American Games, the quota will be lost and may not be transferred to the country or to any other athlete.

APPENDIX B – GLOSSARY

Contingency means a future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty.

Delegation Event means the Olympic Games, the Olympic Winter Games, the Paralympic Games, the Paralympic Winter Games, the Pan American Games, and the Parapan American Games.

Force Majeure means an event or effect that cannot be reasonably anticipated or controlled (e.g., hurricane,

tornado, etc.).

Grievance Procedures means the process that enables an athlete to file a complaint with the NGB or USOPC.

Jurisdiction means the power or authority to make decisions and judgments.

Nominated means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted to the USOPC by an NGB for participation in the Games.

Protected Competition means a Delegation Event or a Qualifying Competition.

Qualifying Competition means either of the following:

- ii. **NGB Qualifying Competition:** Any competition or activity organized or approved by the NGB where the athlete's performance or results are considered in the published selection criteria to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.
- iii. International Qualifying Competition: Any international sport competition where (i) athletes represent the United States against athletes representing other nations, (ii) the NGB officially designates entrants, as required by the competition organizers, and (iii) athlete results or performance are included in the published criteria to qualify, or be selected, to represent the United States in a Delegation Event.

Selected means an athlete, coach or staff member whose name has been submitted by the USOPC to the LOC at the final submission date, as determined by the LOC.
